

CONSULTATIONS FOR HAITIAN TPS APPLICANTS



On January 15, 2010, Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Janet Napolitano, announced the designation of Haiti for Temporary Protected Status (TPS) in response to the January 12, 2010 earthquake in Haiti. TPS gives immigrants permission to stay and work in the US for the next 18 months.



The Department of Immigration Services is offering legal consultations and representation to Haitian TPS applicants. This will continue for the duration of the registration period (through July 20th, 2010). All matters are treated professionally and confidentially.



- Please note that only Haitian TPS related consultations will be screened during Wednesdays' intake, 3 PM – 6 PM.
- For **naturalization or citizenship**, continue to come on Tuesdays 1PM – 5PM.
- For **all other matters**, continue to come on Thursdays from 8:30AM – 11AM.


